Both the rounds were held from 2 p.m-5 p.m for grades 9 & 10. Due to an active acknowledgement by the She-panthers, there was an extension of two topics for each round. A MUSSOORIE MYSTERY

"In 1911, a British spiritualist was found dead at the Savoy in her room, which was locked from inside. Her ghost is still said to haunt the property". (from an article in the Scroll)

The Savoy Hotel in Mussoorie was established in 1902. The owner Mr. Cecil Lincoln had it built in Edwardian style. The hotel soon would acquire a reputation to rival that of the Raffles in Singapore. It became a favourite with European elite and Indian Royalty within a short span of time.

There was more fame/notoriety in store for The Savoy. In the summer of 1911, a British lady Frances Garnett-Orme -a dabbler in occult practises - visited the Queen of Hills and stayed at The Savoy. She was accompanied by another spiritualist - Eva Mountstephen from Lucknow. Orme had a tragic past. Her fiancée died a few days before marriage. This made her turn to paranormal and séances.

It so happened that Eva Mountstephen left Mussoorie early one morning and Orme was later found dead in her room at The Savoy. The strange thing was that the room was locked from inside. The post-mortem report indicated poisoning. Eva Mountstephen was the prime suspect and tried for homicide but the charges were not upheld by any Court of Law. A couple of months later the medic who had performed the post-mortem was also found dead having been poisoned.

The mystery around Orme's death still remains unsolved but rumours of her spirit haunting the area started spreading. The mysterious circumstances of Orme's murder inspired Agatha Christie to pen 'The Mysterious Affair at Styles' which was the 1st appearance of Hercule Poirot. 'In A Crystal Ball -A Mussoorie Mystery' written by Mussoorie's favourite novelist also owes its theme to the unsolved mystery surrounding Orme's death.

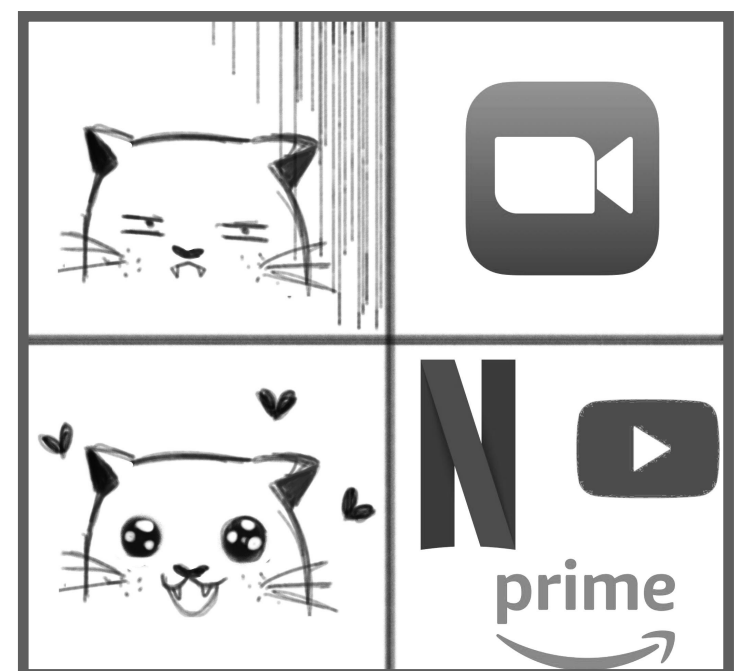
IT'S NOT A DECEPTION
